Instead, it speaks softly of luxurious, rich, timeless fabrics and an understated approach to dressing that has become the "effortlessly chic" style of well-informed, well-dressed and sophisticated consumers. Brands such as Loro Piana and Brunello Cucinelli for cashmere, wardrobe pieces from The Row and leather goods from Bottega Veneta, among others, make up this category of exclusive minimalism in clothing and accessories.

These pieces reveal the richness of a more restrained attitude, timeless quality and craftsmanship, and when paired with fine jewelry with similar attributes, offer an understated yet sophisticated approach.

Here, we highlight some pieces from independent designers and antique/vintage styles that emanate the trend of discreet luxury – a trend that has always been present in a measured way and that has a lot of room to evolve.

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Jewelry, new and old, is set with antique diamonds: the rose, mine, European and portrait cut types. The personality of these styles is related to a more subtle attitude when using diamonds that shine from the art of being cut and faceted by hand and, when recycled and incorporated into contemporary pieces, are less flashy than brilliant cuts.

The effective combination of ancient and modern details in a current piece also gives it a poetic nature, which is more related to wearing jewelry that allows you to shine without being overshadowed.

These pieces of jewelry are the kind that can be part of your daily routine, just like the clothes you love to wear – comfortable, unpretentious and elegant – and worn carefree while carrying out everyday tasks.

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
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
